


From Randy's Desk...

Fly fishing is a big sport in our area. We have many fine waters to tempt the fly angler.

Though many of us do travel to the American West once a year, mainly we fish area waters. Why is it then that most of the fishing books and even the fly tying books are about the west or are written by western Anglers? Oh sure, there are a few books dealing with eastern hatches, but there are almost no books about eastern fishing itself. Perhaps this is because so many of our famous eastern anglers have passed on. Still it would be nice to have more books and magazines about our area.

With so many great waters to fish, we can only hope that this will remain so. Marcellus Shale Drilling poses a serious threat to many of our waters. Our state seems ill prepared to deal with the drilling. Waste water, though treated somewhat, may be released into Pennsylvania streams and rivers. There is a question about what this fracking water will do to underground water sources. Do we have enough inspectors and regulations to cover all of the drilling sites and problems which may arise? What is going to happen to our roads? There will be no money to pay for repairs to the roads for damage caused by trucks because we do not have any tax on the gas being removed. I hope that we eastern anglers will not be forced to depend on the west for our trout fishing.
