Twelve Days of Christmas Tickets

Each year MLTU sells five hundred tickets, which we call the Twelve Days of Christmas. We use the proceeds from these tickets to pay for chapter functions during the year, such as the newsletter, fly tying courses, and our chapter website. Usually a member will receive five tickets, though some may receive more. It is very important that you either buy them yourself or sell the tickets that you receive. Last year was the first time in a long while that we did not sell all of the tickets.

Here is how each ticket works. Each ticket contains two, three digit numbers based on the seven o'clock drawing of the Pennsylvania Lottery's daily number. The cost of a ticket is \$5.00. Winners are based on the 7:00 PM drawing of the Pennsylvania Lottery daily number for December 1st through the 12th. Each ticket has two numbers, giving the holder two chances to win each day. That means you have twenty-four total chances to win during this time period. The winner each day will receive \$100.00 from the chapter.


